Aim:

To support the knowledge and understanding of the subject matter, themes and issues studied in the practical lessons. Students will also learn and develop their theatrical design skills. Where possible tasks will allow students to use their imagination and creativity as well developing their abilities in drama theory. Students will be required to complete one main piece of homework a half term and two research tasks per half term. Rehearsal homework could take place in a group after school or at lunchtime.

Marking and feedback:

- 1. Students will be continually be given oral feedback and 1:1 support on practical pieces.
- 2. Homework tasks will be checked for completion and feedback provided on how to improve. These will not be graded pieces.
- 3. Research tasks will feed into the practical work and will be graded and given oral CPR feedback as an entire piece of work.
