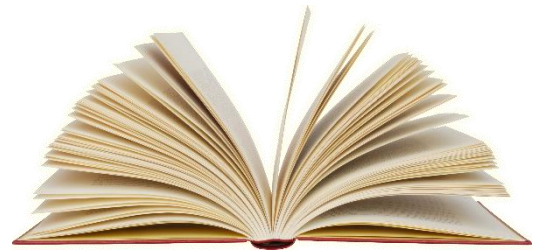


Book review
